Using the Trust DVD

- Everyone that was present said that they had signed off on it and passed it on to the next person on the list. The last known person was Christy Truscott who was not present.
- Jim reminded everyone that we are required to view it and sign off that we have seen it, regardless of how many times we have viewed it in the past.

Funds from Book Fair

- Mr. Robinson shared that our Book Fair brought in a substantial amount of money once again. He mentioned that it was near \$16,000. He shared that we can take the money (25% of the total) or purchase products/items from scholastic at 60 or 65%. He shared the following ideas that PTA had and asked for SCC input. SCC input and ideas are also included below:
 - Purchase books for library
 - Concern is they are not library bound which is necessary for high circulation
 - Purchase books for teacher's libraries
 - Teachers expressed their lack of interest due to lack of good books and quality, as well as having an experienced staff with great libraries already at their disposal.
 - Purchase books for Literacy library
 - Similar response to the ones above
 - Purchase SmartBoards through scholastic
 - Mr. Robinson reminded the group that he looked into this year and found out that the scholastic brand is not supported by our IT department. However, he will look into it and see if that is still the case this year.
 - This was the overall consensus that we would like to see these start to appear in our building. Mr. Robinson said he would look into this and let us know what our next options are. One being, taking the money from scholastic and purchasing the district supported SmartBoards.
 - New teachers could also benefit from getting some books for their libraries.

Nomination/Vote:

- Mrs. Moon was nominated and elected for vice chair of the SCC due to the fact that Julie Winfree is no longer at Lone Peak Elementary – unanimous decision

CSIP (Continuous School Improvement Plan)

- Mr. Robinson shared CSIP plan that was created and approved by the school improvement committee.
- CSIP goals are focused on our needs in math, language arts, and school wide expectations/positive behavior
- Goals in language arts and math are basically the same since our needs are the same in both subject areas. The three school goals read:
 - All students will continue to make steady gains in all areas of mathematics and have more students meet proficiency standards as reported on the annual Criterion Reference Test (CRT) exams and Curriculum Based Measurement (CBM) math assessments.
 - All students will continue to make steady gains in all areas of language arts and have more students meet proficiency standards as reported on the annual Criterion Referenced Test (CRT) exams and Curriculum Based Measurement (CBM) reading assessments.
 - Lone Peak Elementary will promote students' positive behavior and academic success by creating school-wide behavior expectations, and having students participate in character education and enrichment activities.
- Mr. Robinson also explained the budget for CSIP (Continuous School Improvement Plan) and how it has changed with our new district. Now we have more freedom with our money to meet our school's needs, but are just as accountable for those funds as we have always been. This freedom simply allows us to provide our teachers and students what they need in order to accomplish the goals listed in the CSIP plan.
- All in attendance supported the plan and goals.

District Boundary Steering Committee update

- Jim Jensen shared what has been taking place with the boundary changes and the committee that he sits on to discuss these plans.
- Most of the meetings and time have been spent with people from city, county, etc coming in and sharing plans, ideas, things to consider etc.
- Only about 40 minutes have been allocated to actually discussing the possible changes.
- Everything is still on the table, including elementary schools, and they are still anxious to hear all ideas and suggestions.
- What would happen with our high school students? – Will some be going to Alta and some going to the new school? This will all depend on what changes are made with the current and future boundary alignment.
- Anyone may attend the meetings and participate. They are held every Wednesday from 4 to 5 pm at the 3rd East District Office Building (one by Mount Jordan and Jordan Commons).
